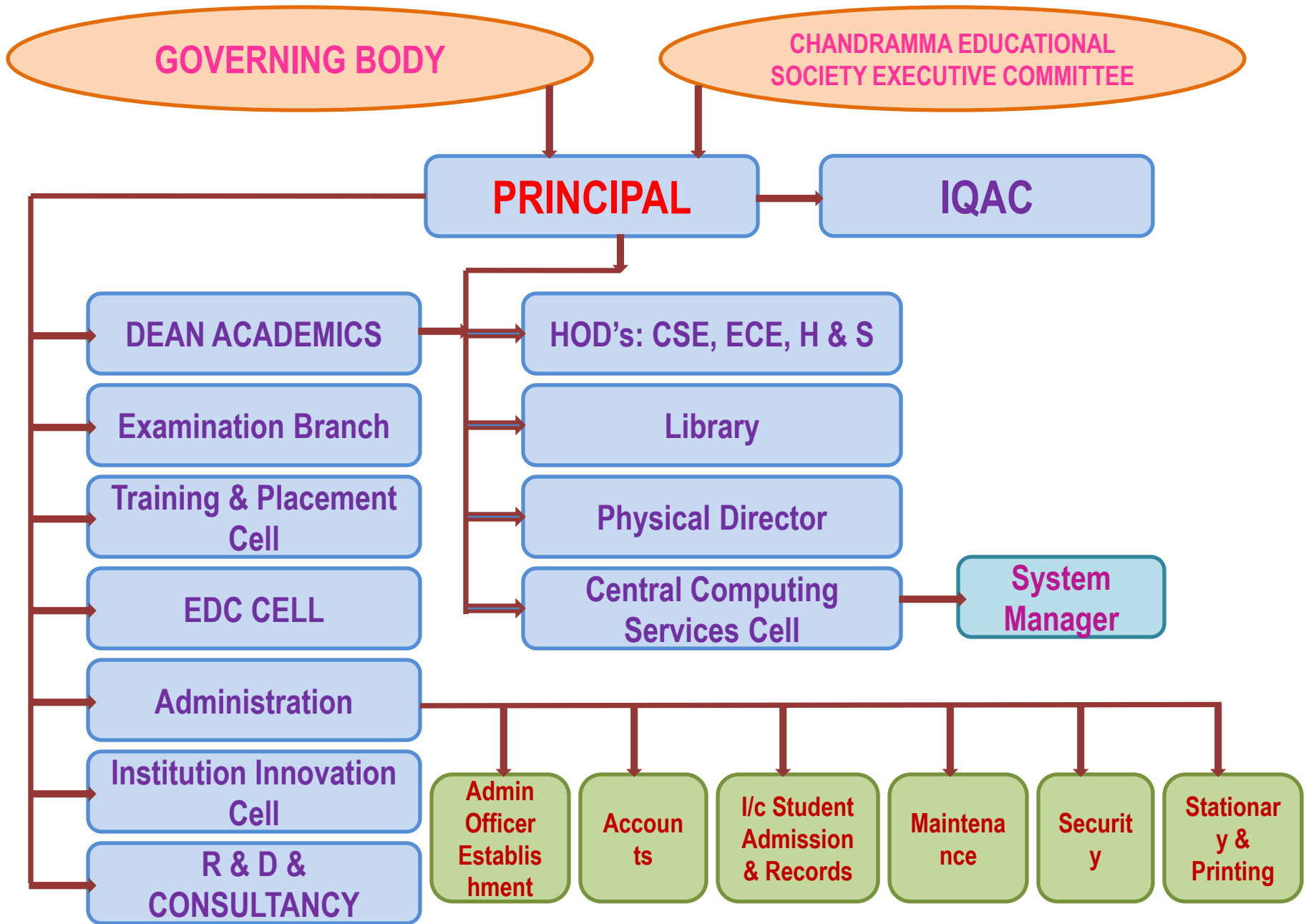
### **Grievance Redressal Mechanism:**
